



School Sport Partnership Overview

Following the announcement of the Primary PE and Sport Grant, your School has entered into a 2 year agreement with the West Lancashire School Sport Partnership between September 2013 and August 2015.

Your new service will include delivery of PE and School Sport on a weekly basis in your School by a School Sport Specialist. Each half term your school will access a different School Sport Specialist who will deliver their Specialist area of the National Curriculum.

The 6 areas that your School will receive support in include:
Gymnastics, Dance, Invasion Games, Net & Wall, Striking and Fielding and Athletics & Outdoor Adventurous Activities.

The School Sport Specialist will deliver Curriculum PE lessons, providing Continued Professional Development for School Staff and deliver Lunchtime and After School Clubs during their weekly visits to your School.

In addition to the provision provided by a School Sport Specialist your School as a member of the West Lancashire School Sport Partnership will have access to all services/opportunities that we deliver throughout the academic year detailed within this Service Level Agreement.

All 8 West Lancashire Secondary Schools have committed to the continued release of a School Sport Co-ordinator who you will also have the opportunity to work with at a local level.

The Primary PE and Sport Grant provides us with a fantastic opportunity to work collaboratively across West Lancashire to ensure that we deliver an Inclusive PE and School Sport Programme that meets the needs of every Young Person in your School.

1.1 PURPOSE OF DOCUMENT

This Service Level Agreement outlines the provision and services available to member schools of the West Lancashire School Sport Partnership (WLSSP) to support schools in relation to the development of PE and School Sport.

1.2 DESCRIPTION OF THE SERVICES

WLSSP will work in partnership with schools to provide a comprehensive, flexible and responsive service that supports the development and delivery of PE and School Sport in an effective and professional manner.

In addition to the services and provision detailed within this offer the WLSSP will represent schools at a local, regional and national level to secure funding and commissioned work that will benefit all member Schools.

1.2.1 COST OF SERVICE

Your membership to the West Lancashire School Sport Partnership which includes half a day support per week from a School Sport Specialist will be charged at the agreed rate of £3750 per academic year.

1.3 SERVICE DELIVERY

- Be a proactive partner of the WLSSP and take advantage of the service and opportunities on offer for the benefit of the young people in your school.

1.3.1 Qualifications and Experience

The service will be delivered by appropriately qualified, experienced and skilled staff who have an understanding of young people and the local community in which they work. All staff will meet the minimum operating standards established by Lancashire County Council and WLSSP.

This agreement is for a 2 year period beginning on the 1st September 2013 and ending on the 31st August 2015. Schools are encouraged to discuss any concerns they may have with services/provision at any time throughout the agreement period.
